Mt. Vernon and Center Update



In 2023, the owner of the property at Mt. Vernon and Center had a proposal that residents of High-grove didn't care for. Steven Berzansky went back to the drawing board with our suggestions and offered a proposal he hopes residents will like.

The commercial part of the proposal (7-11 convenience store and business center) was dropped.. Instead of Condos, we are being offered *single family residences in a gated community*. He says that they will be high end and bring up the value of surrounding homes.

Yet, Mr. Berzansky is proposing more homes on his ten acres than nearby residents prefer. His new proposal will not change R-1 as the zoning, but instead of very low density, the condos would require rezoning to Medium High Density. But he did listen to some of our concerns. His new proposal contains homes instead of condos; longer driveways so fewer cars are on the streets and wider streets.

Clarrissa Cervantes Arrested for DUI July 1, 2024

Riverside City Councilwoman Clarissa Perez Cervantes plead guilty to misdemeanor driving under the influence and was sentenced to three years' probation as it was her second offense.

The CHP stopped her while speeding on I10.

She was arraigned at the Banning Justice Center for her July 1st, 2024 arrest.

Her probation includes 57 days in a Sheriff's work release program ordered by Riverside County Superior Court Judge Sylwia Luttrell.

The defendant's attorney, Paul Grech, did not respond to a request for comment.

Seem like a harsh punishment? Driving under the influence can have major consequences. "It endangers the public and exposes the state to significant liability" said Assemblyman Bill Essayli, Norco, a former prosecutor, "DUI is a horrific crime that kills over 1,000 Californians a year." and added that Clarissa Cervantes' conviction serves to reinforce the importance of House Resolution 51, which he proposed earlier this year.

"Clarissa Cervantes pled guilty to her second DUI criminal conviction while still seeking to become a member of the state Assembly," Essayli said. "This only underscores the urgent need to pass House Resolution 51, which would prohibit a member of the Assembly from using a taxpayerfunded car... following a DUI conviction."

Essayli said a DUI conviction should automatically invalidate privileges to "a taxpayer-funded car."

The assemblyman also pointed to state Sen. Dave Min, Irvine, as another example of why Resolution





Councilwoman Cervantes July 1, 2024 Mugshot 51 should be on the front burner.

Min was sentenced to three years' probation after pleading guilty to a misdemeanor DUI as he drove his car at night without headlights a couple of miles from the Capitol Building.

Resolution 51 would mandate that any Assemblymember who is arrested and charged with DUI lose -- until his or her case is resolved -- the privilege of using a "pool vehicle" while in Sacramento, and for three years following a conviction.

The measure has been awaiting a hearing in the Assembly Committee on Rules for more than a month.

The Legislature is due to adjourn on Sept. 14



the responses were less than encouraging:

"If I was born at home, I would not have survived." "I hope you have a backup plan."

"My wife found out that it's impossible for her to deliver naturally, so she couldn't have done that."

"Wow, you are so brave. I could NEVER do that."

Despite their apprehensions, I went through with it. This is the story of Freeman's home birth.

Part I: Pre-Conception

In the summer of 2021, we were a little over two ing for a whole week. years into our marrage. I was struggling with major hormonal imbalances and had lost a lot of weight. I on the kitchen floor and grabbed a pregnancy test had two periods in seventeen months. My hair was falling out by the fistful.

I remember my husband Sam walking into the bath- appear. That's not what I expected. room after I had just finished showering, to find a pile of hair on the shower floor. "Did that all come from your head? Just now?"

I had begun working with a lady named Deb Lowrance that April. My friend Teri was using her as a midwife for her upcoming home birth. Deb specializes in midwifery care and women's health. She had me do a blood panel, revealing that my levels of progesterone and estrogen - what my body needed to reproduce were in the range of a post menopausal woman. In other words, practically non-existent.

She had me take copious amounts of Vitex, an herb used to regulate menstrual problems. She also suggested I increase my protein and carb consumption and gain some weight, as she doubted that I was eating enough to sustain my cycle.

Sam and I had been on the same page from the beginning: we wanted a family, and a big one at that. We had reached the age when scrolling through our respective Instagram feeds shows birth announcement after birth announcement. It felt isolating, realizing that it could be years before that stage of life became our reality.

Despite the extreme improbability of getting pregnant, I thought about it constantly. I took a pregnancy test at every sign. Signs including, but not limited to, a births confirmed my decision. missed period. Which for me, was nearly every month. Sam and I didn't talk much about having a family around that time. It seemed like a physical impossibility. But all this didn't stop me from getting my hopes up, only to be disappointed with every negative test.

I finally had a period in June 2021, and I was ecstatic. Were my hormonal struggles a thing of the past? My hopes were dashed once again when July came and went with no period. Back to the drawing board for me.

I was disappointed, but not surprised when I missed

my August period too. It seemed like a normal occur-When I told people I was having a home birth, rence at this point. But as I would soon find out, this time was quite different.

Part II: Pregnancy

It was a Thursday in September, and I was on my way home after a post-work grocery shopping trip. A thought crossed my mind: my boobs hurt. My boobs have never hurt before. That's strange. And I feel like they've been hurting for at least a few days now.

I was using the Fitbit app to log any semblance of period symptoms, so while I was driving (sorry Mom), I pulled up the app. Sure enough, they had been hurt-

Upon arriving at home, I dropped all the groceries from the closet. I peed on the stick and set it on the bathroom sink. Two pink lines immediately began to

I walked aimlessly around the house for a while, leaving my piles of groceries to reach room temperature on the floor. I was in shock. How was this even possible? I had to take another test. As I waited for my bladder to fill again, I did a quick Google search



on false positives. Looks like they are not very common. I must be the exception.

I took a second test. Then a third test. Positive, and positive again.

For me, having a home birth was just about a given from the beginning. I was born at home; my brother was born at home. My aunt birthed seven children at home. I didn't know much about birth, but I knew that I would likely feel more comfortable at home over the hospital. Researching home births and hospital

A little over two weeks after the positive tests, on a Saturday morning, I had the privilege of being present at my friend Teri's home birth. While I had been in the house for many of my aunt's home births, I had never paid much attention. In fact, I actively tried to not be in the room when the birth was taking place.

But, now that I knew what was coming less than nine months down the road, witnessing a birth was a much different experience.





Sam didn't know much about home birth, but he was naturally minded, and open to the idea. The more he learned about it, the more it made sense to him. I remember his face when he watched his first birth video in the documentary The Business of Being Born. I wondered if he would be that horrified when I was giving birth.

I had already been working with Deb to resolve my hormonal issues, so it made sense that I would work with her throughout pregnancy, too. And now, I had even witnessed her work at an actual birth. What stood out most to me was her calm demeanor. She didn't say much as Teri was giving birth - only what needed to be said, and that was very little. Teri gave birth as her body knew how to, and Deb respected that.

I learned as much as I could to support myself and my baby. I devoured books on home birth, hypnobirthing, prenatal nutrition, cosleeping, breastfeeding, and postpartum. I listened to hours upon hours of podcasts like *Happy Homebirth* and *Doing It At Home*. Sam and I took a birth class together, which gave us both a better idea of what to expect during the birth.

Deb began every appointment with, "what questions do you have for me today?" and I would come at her with the lengthy list I had developed since the last time we talked. She was honest and reasonable in her answers. If I forgot a question or needed an answer before my next appointment, I could text her anytime - even if the question was on behalf of a pregnant friend, and not myself. She was clearly eager to follow evidence based practices, even if the current medical model opposed them.

I was blessed to have a great pregnancy overall. First trimester exhaustion was on a level I did not think was possible. There were nights it took everything in me to get off the couch to go to bed. Doing dishes after dinner was not going to happen. I did fine at work as long as I remained standing. A body in motion stays in motion. It's a good thing, I decided, that teachers don't often get a chance to sit down. I had some morning sickness during the first trimester, but it was mostly remedied once I stopped taking vitamins on an empty stomach. I only threw up once.

I ran three 5Ks while pregnant, the last one on Thanksgiving Day. It was at that point that I decided to stop running. A ligament in my foot hurt badly, and running was only making it worse. Looking back, I see my body was signaling to take it easy. Nourishing myself became easier without a four mile run every day.

I had my anatomy scan ultrasound at 21 weeks. We decided to not find out the gender. Results from the ultrasound showed that my placenta was close to my cervix. Deb was concerned that my pregnancy could


result in placenta previa, a condition where the placenta covers the cervix, therefore preventing a vaginal birth. Deb encouraged me to receive a third trimester ultrasound to make sure my placenta had moved to a more optimal position. However, the placenta typically moves as the uterus grows, and I was not in a high risk group for placenta previa. I also wanted to avoid unnecessary ultrasounds for the health of my baby. Deb honored my decision to decline..

I declined much of the testing and interventions typical in the medical model. Deb supported and encouraged me in those decisions. For example, I chose to opt out of the usual glucose test. Instead, I monitored my blood sugar by tracking my numbers and food choices for a week, sharing the results with Deb. I did not take any vaccines or other injections.

I also chose to opt out of the Strep B test, as I did not plan on taking antibiotics anyway. Instead, I took probiotics everyday of my pregnancy, and I doubled up as my due date got closer. Water birth has been shown to decrease the risk of infection, and that is what I planned to do.

As my due date inched closer, my biggest fear was that I would not be able to relax enough to birth this baby. I had read a book on hypnobirthing, but I hadn't practiced anything with consistency. At Week 36, I was fearful that it was too late.

I shared these fears with Sam, and he encouraged me that any amount of practice could only benefit me and our baby. He created a playlist for me of relaxing songs. Every night, I would turn off the lights, run lavender in my diffuser, and practice deep-breathing to the playlist. Through repetition, I taught my body

He did make concessions, however for the closest residents affected by moving the home footprint forward 4' (in which a row of privacy trees of their choice will be planted) and the bedroom windows of homes to be built not to look into existing homes' backyards; providing 8' high walls and residents will also be given the option of connecting to sewer.


Why It's the 1st Amendment by Jim Rickards


