For New Developments

Special assessment reports known as an Engineer's Report for each individual development project determines the level of service, the cost for those services, and the annual special assessment amount per home. New communities (i.e. Spring Mountain Ranch, The Heights, Meridian Pointe, etc.) have an assessment unique to each new community. The range among new development is \$554.42 to \$3,005.54. These assessments cover the cost for services including landscape maintenance along the public streets, maintenance of water quality basins, trail systems, and parks within those communities. Each community pays specifically for the services provided within that residential development in addition to the original \$120/parcel for extended sheriff. The acceptance of the report and special assessments by the developer acts as voter approval and is inherited by homeowners upon purchase of homes.







Natural Allergy Remedies

We are blessed to live in California with our normally amazing weather! Yet allergies seem to be more and more common here... So is stress.

Could there be a connection?

Could the miserable stuffy nose, sneezing, puffy, watery eyes and exhaustion have to do with stress?

If so, strengthening the adrenals - the organs that put out adrenaline and get tired with too much stress - may help! Have you noticed when stress was high that allergies were high?

If strengthening our adrenals helps allergies, as it has for me, we can start by looking at what might be draining your adrenals (besides stress), then we will look at nutrients to strengthen the adrenals.

When you think of the adrenal glands think adrenaline! How do you feel when you get to the top and the rollercoaster picks up speed on the way down? That "fight or flight" response feeling is adrenaline put out by the adrenals!

Adrenaline is a hormone that serves an amazing purpose. It helps your body prepare for an emergency! But it is not healthy to always be in this state. Drinking coffee all day, every day, can stress out our adrenals because we make our adrenals produce more adrenaline. After awhile the adrenals get tired.

Have you noticed that coffee doesn't help you much anymore? Are you more tired? Do you have new allergies when the spring season and pollen appears?

These are signs that you may have adrenal fatigue. What can we do about it naturally?

One of my favorite ways to help the adrenals is so simple! Vitamin C is a great food for the adrenals! In nature, vitamin C is found with bioflavonoids (as in the white or "pith" of citrus rinds). Bioflavonoids like quercetin (remember from past issues, a zincionophore that brings zinc into the cells to stop

the replication of a virus) can reduce the histamine response. 2000 mg of vitamin C taken daily with 500mg bioflavonoids (I like non gmo Ester C). B5 or pantothenic acid is another adrenal strengthener I take in a ratio of C1000:B5 500mg (that quantity is not easy to find, but Clark's Nutritional Centers carries it) and can help you feel more energy and reduce allergy symptoms while you rebuild the adrenals.

Try it and let me know what you think!

Another way to strengthen the adrenals is to do what the American Indians used to do. It may sound strange to our modern ears, but there were Indians that used to eat every part of the animal... the organ meats - especially the adrenals - were strongly prized. This tiny organ meat was so valuable that they would divide it up between every person in the tribe - from child to adult. Adrenal glandular (the modern form in a capsule;) is highest in vitamin C, strengthens the adrenals and was a secret they normally didn't share with other tribes and especially not with the white man! But Dr. Price was a different white man. They found he was not after money or riches from the tribe. Highgrove: Small Town or Not? By Sabrina Brooks What makes a town a small town? Is it a

population number, derived from a census? Or is the definition a little more complex? Growing up in Highgrove, I felt like I lived in a small town. We knew our neighbors. We actively participated in our community. We ran into people we knew everywhere we went. After living in the Midwest for almost five years, my definition of a small town has shifted. But the fond memories of my childhood in Highgrove remain.

My family moved from San Bernardino to Mandarin Way when I was 7 years old, then from Mandarin Way to Owetzal Lane when I was 12. My parents (Ron and Cynthia Cruz) ran the Highgrove baseball league, which meant it was my duty at 14 to both run the snack bar and coach the local "Little Squirts" tee ball team. When I was 18, I went off to college in Santa Clarita. When I was 23, I got married and moved to Casey, a small town in southeastern Illinois. It has been nearly a decade since I left Owetzal Lane, but I often catch myself referring to Highgrove as "back home," and I think I always will.

Casey, Illinois, with its one stop light and population 2,404, is a small town. Highgrove, California, is smack-dab between 2 of the top 14 highest populated counties in America. No one in the Midwest would think to call that a "small town." But Highgrove was the center of my memories as a child. And no matter how much I tease my parents for calling Highgrove a small town, I understand what they mean. It felt small when I grew up, and I know it still feels small to them, too.

What made Highgrove feel small for my brother and me? It was being involved and present in our community.

We attended every Highgrove Day. We rode our bikes through the orange groves. We hiked Blue Mountain too many times to count.

Us and another 30 parents and children volunteered to serve the elderly at Norton Younglove Community Center for a day. In exchange, we all received tickets to Disneyland, which we also attended together.

A massive group of us sung Christmas carols around our neighborhood every year. I'm proud that, 21 years after moving to Highgrove, my parents continue to play an active role in their community.

Whether I stay in Casey for the rest of my life, or go elsewhere, I want to do my part to make my town feel small. I want my two-year-old




