
Yes, there are inconsiderate folks who chase them. But worse, might be those of us who love the burros enough to bring them down from their safer hill havens by giving them food or water.

The Declaration of Independence July 4, 1776

"When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.

That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed. That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying



Every month I find more reasons to thank Supervisor Jeffries for his logical thought process and productive action on behalf of our community.

(I will be sad when he is replaced in January.)

Search for his Newsletter and you will find a perfect example of his thought process differing from proposals being considered. This month he asks the logical question, why not cut back the undergrowth in our attempts to prevent wildfires?

He also mentions that Employers may have to pay more to make up for CALPers (the retirements for Federal Employees) wanting to sell off all stock having to do with fossil fuels.

[Cars that run on gas and even all electric cars) require fossil fuels in the building or running of them! This will cost ALL of us as taxpayers and even business owners! Consider also the research that found solar panels costing \$1 million per year AFTER accounting for the energy they produce!]

From his newsletter:

"Warehouse Relief or State Meddling? Or Both? Some of you may recall that several years ago I pushed for a Riverside County Good Neighbor policy that sought to adopt stringent new warehouse standards largely to protect adjacent residential homes and neighborhoods from the encroachment of new warehouses. I am a strong advocate for private property rights – BUT – I believe that those private property rights apply on both sides of the fence, not just the developer side.

Unfortunately, my original Good Neighbor proposal which included mandatory separation/distance standards between warehouses and homes was significantly watered down and actually made optional. Now after several years of Riverside County being ground zero for new warehouse construction, the State Legislature has several bills (AB 1000 & AB 1748) that would do what the local leaders couldn't or wouldn't do to help protect quality of life concerns. Now, does it irk the heck out of me that state officials are going to try and insert themselves (again) into local land use decisions? YES it does! BUT, if local leaders can't or won't act to protect their own constituents - then

we have no one to blame but ourselves when someone else steps in to try.






Wherever I am, there's always Pooh,

"I'm never afraid with you."



TOXIC EXPOSURES

Infants Who Receive Multiple Vaccines at Once at 'Exponentially' Greater Risk of Disease, Developmental Delays

JUNE 20, 2024 The more vaccines an infant receives at once, the greater the chance the infant will develop an infection, a respiratory illness or developmental delays following their shots, according to a peer-reviewed study published Wednesday in the International Journal of Vaccine Theory, Practice, and Research.

be deafening," lead author (https://childrenshealthdefense.org/chd-conference/karl-jablonowski-ph-d), senior research scientist at (https://childrenshealthdefense.org)" Children's Health Defense (CHD), told The Defender, "The sheer number of diseases increases exponentially with every added vaccine."

Jablonowski and CHD's Chief Scientific Officer Brian Hooker, Ph.D., analyzed 20 years worth of data from 1,542,076 vaccine combinations administered to infants under age 1.

The data, collected from July 1, 1991, to May 31, 2011, came from the publicly available Florida Medicaid Database, which contains more than 460 million billing claims from over 10 million people.

The researchers examined the medical diagnoses given to vaccinated infants within 30 days after vaccination. They excluded diagnoses made on the day the babies received the shots, to eliminate any possible preexisting conditions.

The study compared babies who received three "base vaccines" to babies who received those same vaccines plus others in a single pediatrician visit.

The control group consisted of 227,231 cases of infants who in one visit only received the (https:// www.cdc.gov/vaccines/hcp/vis/vis-statements/dtap. html) Haemophilus influenzae type b (https://www. cdc.gov/vaccines/vpd/hib/) and the inactivated poliovirus vaccine (https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/vpd/ polio/hcp/routine-polio-vaccination.html)

They compared medical outcomes among that group to outcomes for cohorts of infants who also received either the (https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/

vpd/hepb/) hepatitis B (HepB) vaccine, the (https:// www.cdc.gov/vaccines/vpd/pneumo/public/index. html) pneumococcal vaccine (PCV), or the (https:// www.cdc.gov/vaccines/pubs/pinkbook/rota.html) rotavirus vaccine, or different combinations of two or three of those vaccines administered together.

The researchers found seven cohorts of infants in "If safety signals sounded alarms, the results the database who received different vaccine combiwould be deafening," said Karl Jablonowski, Ph.D., nations — ranging, for example, from base vaccines plus HepB to base vaccines plus HepB, PCV and rotavirus — and compared those to the control group.

> They used the (https://online.stat.psu.edu/stat504/ book/export/html/708) Fisher's Exact Test statistical model to compare the frequency of a particular disease following the shots in one cohort with the frequency of the same disease in another cohort.

> They also used Bonferroni correction, a (https:// www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pmc/articles/PMC6099145/) powerful statistical tool, to eliminate any random results and implemented a high bar for identifying statistical significance.

"With any statistical test you can never be 100% "If safety signals sounded alarms, the results would confident of your results," Jablonowski said. "However, we set our bar so high that we are 99.99% confident the diseases we report are associated with vaccine combinations."

> They identified 45 different statistically significant diagnoses for respiratory, developmental and suspected infectious diseases following the different vaccine combinations.

> They summarized the illnesses and their relative risk, or the likelihood they would occur in the group (https://childrenshealthdefense.org/)defender_category/toxic-exposures/) exposed to excess vaccines, for the various cohorts.

> Overall they found that as the number of shots given to infants in a single doctor's visit increased, the number of developmental respiratory or infectious disease diagnoses within 30 days of the shots increased exponentially.

> Each additional shot more than doubled the number of those different diseases diagnosed. For example, one additional vaccine resulted in an average of seven additional illnesses occurring at statistically significant rates in a given cohort of babies.

> Two additional vaccines resulted in an average of 15 diseases, and three vaccines administered resulted in an additional 35 diseases.

> Respiratory diseases — including cough, asthma, obstructive bronchitis and many others — were the most common recurring conditions following any different combinations of vaccines.

> Jablonowski and Hooker said respiratory illnesses likely occurred due to vaccine-induced "maladapted immune response and a poor adaptation to environ-**Infants who Receive Multiple Vaccines (Cont. P.15)**

"Independence" Cont. from Front P. its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness.

Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed.

But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security. Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government. The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid world.

He has refused his Assent to Laws, the most wholesome and necessary for the public good.

He has forbidden his Governors to pass Laws of immediate and pressing importance, unless suspended in their operation till his Assent should be obtained; and when so suspended, he has utterly neglected to attend to them.

He has refused to pass other Laws for the accommodation of large districts of people, unless those people would relinquish the right of Representation in the Legislature, a right inestimable to them and formidable to tyrants only.

He has called together legislative bodies at places unusual, uncomfortable, and distant from the depository of their public Records, for the sole purpose of fatiguing them into compliance with pretended offences his measures.

He has dissolved Representative Houses repeatedly, for opposing with manly firmness his invasions on the rights of the people.

He has refused for a long time, after such dissolutions, to cause others to be elected; whereby the Legislative powers, incapable of Annihilation, have returned to the People at large for their exercise; the State remaining in the mean time exposed

to all the dangers of invasion from without, and convulsions within.

He has endeavoured to prevent the population of these States; for that purpose obstructing the Laws for Naturalization of Foreigners; refusing to pass others to encourage their migrations hither, and raising the conditions of new Appropriations of Lands.

He has obstructed the Administration of Justice, by refusing his Assent to Laws for establishing Judiciary powers.

He has made Judges dependent on his Will alone, for the tenure of their offices, and the amount and payment of their salaries.

He has erected a multitude of New Offices, and sent hither swarms of Officers to harrass our people, and eat out their substance.

He has kept among us, in times of peace, Standing Armies without the Consent of our legislatures.

He has affected to render the Military independent of and superior to the Civil power.

He has combined with others to subject us to a jurisdiction foreign to our constitution, and unacknowledged by our laws; giving his Assent to their Acts of pretended Legislation:

For Quartering large bodies of armed troops among us:

For protecting them, by a mock Trial, from punishment for any Murders which they should commit on the Inhabitants of these States:

For cutting off our Trade with all parts of the world:

For imposing Taxes on us without our Consent:

For depriving us in many cases, of the benefits of Irial by Jury:

For transporting us beyond Seas to be tried for

For abolishing the free System of English Laws in a neighbouring Province, establishing therein an Arbitrary government, and enlarging its Boundaries so as to render it at once an example and fit instrument for introducing the same absolute rule into these Colonies:

For taking away our Charters, abolishing our most valuable Laws, and altering fundamentally the Forms of our Governments:

For suspending our own Legislatures, and declaring themselves invested with power to legislate for us in all cases whatsoever.

He has abdicated Government here, by declaring us out of his Protection and waging War against us.

He has plundered our seas, ravaged our Coasts, burnt our towns, and destroyed the lives of our people.

He is at this time transporting large Armies of foreign Mercenaries to compleat the works of death, desolation and tyranny, already begun with circumstances of Cruelty & perfidy scarcely paralleled in the most barbarous ages, and totally unworthy the Head of a civilized nation.

He has constrained our fellow Citizens taken Captive on the high Seas to bear Arms against their Country, to become the executioners of their friends and Brethren, or to fall themselves by their Hands.

He has excited domestic insurrections amongst us, and has endeavoured to bring on the inhabitants of our frontiers, the merciless Indian Savages, whose known rule of warfare, is an undistinguished destruction of all ages, sexes and conditions.

In every stage of these Oppressions We have Petitioned for Redress in the most humble terms: Our repeated Petitions have been answered only by repeated injury. A Prince whose character is thus marked by every act which may define a Tyrant, is unfit to be the ruler of a free people.


Nor have We been wanting in attentions to our Brittish brethren. We have warned them from time to time of attempts by their legislature to extend an unwarrantable jurisdiction over us. We have reminded them of the circumstances of our emigration and settlement here. We have appealed to their native justice and magnanimity, and we have conjured them by the ties of our common kindred to disavow these usurpations, which, would inevitably interrupt our connections and correspondence. They too have been deaf to the voice of justice and of consanguinity. We must, therefore, acquiesce in the necessity, which denounces our Separation, and hold them, as we hold the rest of mankind, Enemies in War, in Peace Friends.

We, therefore, the Representatives of the united States of America, in General Congress, Assembled,

appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States; that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as Free and Independent States, they have full Power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, establish Commerce, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do. And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.

Developmental conditions like (https://www.hopkinsmedicine.org/health/conditions-and-diseases/ failure-to-thrive) failure to thrive — where a child's physical, mental or social development is delayed, abnormal or ceases — occurred in four cohorts. The researchers suggested it was a result of the vaccines causing dysregulation in the respiratory and immune systems.

One common infection was (https:// my.clevelandclinic.org/health/diseases/17704-highwhite-blood-cell-count) leukocytosis, a high white blood cell count that can indicate a range of infections, inflammations or immune system disorders. Another serious example included sepsis, which occurred in the cohort that received the most shots at once — the base shots plus HepB, PCV and rotavirus.

multiple vaccines not done until now

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) 2024 (https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/schedules/easy-to-read/child-easyread.html) childhood vaccination schedule includes 77 total vaccine doses for children ages 0-18.

The 2024 schedule was expanded to include the pneumococcal and (https://childrenshealthdefense. org/defender category/covid/)COVID-19 vaccines and monoclonal antibodies (https://www.fda.gov/

new-drug-prevent-rsv-babies-and-toddlers) nirsevimab, which are (https://www.nvic.org/newsletter/ aug-2023/nirsevimab-acip-vote-treated-like-vaccine) Despite clear statements, Disease Control (CDC) not technically vaccines but are included on the schedule.

By comparison, the CDC in 1986 recommended 11 doses of 7 vaccines by age 16, including the (https:// childrenshealthdefense.org/defender/mmr-vaccinemedia-measles-outbreaks/) MMR (measles, mumps, rubella), (https://childrenshealthdefense.org/defender/ cdc-ignore-data-convulsions-death-dtp-vaccines/"> DTP, and (https://childrenshealthdefense.org/defender/polio-vaccines-resurgence/) polio vaccines.

With the exception of the HepB vaccine, recommended for infants in their first 24 hours of life, infants rarely receive a single vaccine at a time.

Many vaccines, like the DTP, combine different 'Shockingly reckless' that studies on effects of vaccines for multiple illnesses into a single shot. Also, to adhere to the (https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/schedules/hcp/imz/child-adolescent.html#table-1) CDC schedule, pediatricians commonly administer five or six vaccines and vaccine combinations to babies at each 2-month, 4-month and 6-month visit.


