



Should Parents Have Rights over their Children?

A local school board voted to protect the parent's rights by requiring that parents are notified if the school plans to teach their children about "abberrant sexuality" by re-establishing parental rights in their by-laws. California Education Code 51240 already allows an opt-out form so that a parent may have their child excused from sexual health education (I remember my mother opting out from that for me.) It seems some LGBTQ groups are trying to legislate that they can have children educated on their idea of sex without parental consent.

Haven't parents always had the right to decide what is best for their children? When we were homeschooling in the early 2000s, there was a bill put forth to clearly state that parents had rights and responsibilities over their children. The Homeschool Legal Defense Association (HSLDA.org) wrote the bill to be a constitutional amendment for parental rights as they foresaw a time when government would try to overstep its bounds by claiming that the state - not the parent - has the right to make the decisions for your children.

"The family unit, parental rights, and the protection of children are under threat as never before. It is up to each person to preserve the freedoms" we currently

Warning from Japanese Researchers about Blood

Japanese researchers are warning that using blood from mRNA COVID vaccine recipients could cause potentially deadly effects. They are calling for urgent action to secure the global blood supply.

"Blood contaminated with prion-like structures from the spike protein raises the risk of inducing fatal neurodegenerative diseases in recipients. The potential transmission of harmful proteins through exosomes ("shedding") and the risk of autoimmune diseases due to the vaccines' mechanism and components like lipid nanoparticles (LNPs) are other major concerns." 
They propose interviewing donors, waiting for testing "to ensure the safety of blood products."

"The researchers advocate for comprehensive testing of both jabbed and unjabbed individuals to assess the safety of blood products and suggest discarding blood products contaminated with spike proteins or modified mRNA until effective removal methods have been developed."

They also call for stopping all gene-based "vaccines" and testing "in light of the serious health injuries reported." They also urge countries and organizations to take concrete steps to address and mitigate the already identified risks.

Pfizer now has lawsuits against it for myocarditis, blood clots and deaths that came as a result of their shots. (ChildrensHealthDefense.org)






Seems dystopian, doesn't it? Yet in Germany, children were taken away from their family because they were homeschooling - homeschooling is currently illegal in Germany. A court in Germany ruled that the state did nothing wrong in taking the children from their parents(!)

It seems that wouldn't be needed - our children are our children, right? It is a dangerous and slippery slope to allow the state to make decisions that should be the parents.

School Boards have taken action to make sure that parents retain their rights. The Sacramento state board of education sent a representative (one source says that rep was sent by Newsom) to make clear the state has control over our children.

California Parent Rights

With the massive Education Code in California, it can be hard for parents to decipher what their rights are in the public education system. Here, we list just a few of the parental rights that are stated within Ed Code 51101:

- Examine the curriculum of their child's classes.
- Observe the classroom of a school they wish to enroll their child.
- Meet with the principal of the school.
- Help meet the needs of teachers within the classroom by being a volunteer.
- Be notified if their child is absent from class.
- Request a particular school for their child (this does not have to be granted).
- Have an environment in their child's school that is safe and conducive to learning.

1000 Hours Outside

Did you know that the average American child spends 4-7 minutes of free play outside, while spending 4-7 hours on screens, everyday? This equates to over 1000 hours on an electronic device every year. This statistic was part of the inspiration behind the movement, 1000 Hours Outside, which seeks to reverse those numbers.

Being in nature provides a rich sensory environment in which your children can grow. Spending extensive time outside pushes them to use their imaginations, something that time on a screen could never replicate. They don't have time to get into the immersive outdoor play that they need for healthy development, when recess is only 20 minutes. According Ginny Yurich, the founder of 1000 Hours Outside, "I don't think that screens are evil, but they do represent a lot of opportunity lost."

Ginny began this movement in her days as a young mom, over eleven years ago. With three young children, she was exhausted and overwhelmed. A friend of hers invited her and her kids to begin spending 4-6 hours outside together for a few days a week. The idea came from the writings of Charlotte Mason, a British educator at the turn of the 20th Century. This time outside transformed Ginny's experience as a mom, and she decided that she had to share what she learned with the world.

1000 hours may seem like a lot, but I'd encourage you to not shortchange yourself or your children by decreasing the goal. Modern research is confirming Charlotte Mason's writings. In Balanced and Barefoot: How Unrestricted Outdoor

Sabrina Brooks was raised in Highgrove and taught elementary school for three years before leaving her career to stay home with her son, Freeman. She works from home as a personal assistant to her brother, Robert -Anthony Cruz (aka "Coach RAC").

How to Prevent Sunscreen from Causing Cancer

Know what scares me on this earth? Getting enough vitamin D! Why?

Working as a nutritionist, every time someone had cancer, an auto-immune issue, osteoporosis or any weird symptoms, I would say, "You're low in vitamin D, aren't you?"

They always said, "Yes!" or "How did you know?"

Always. I knew because *those are signs of low vitamin D*. The connection between low vitamin D and cancer/ auto-immune issues became very clear.

A few people have trouble converting sunlight to vitamin D because the kidneys and liver might not work right.

Sun avoidance and liver congestion are two big factors in those who have low vitamin D.

So I'll explain how sunscreen contributes to both - and show you how to get the protection you need while getting the vitamin D you need from the sun.

First of all, sunscreen is said to block the body's ability to make vitamin D.

Secondly, sunscreen can cause liver congestion with the chemicals it contains.

Phthalates are a group of chemicals that are incredibly toxic and weaken immunity. Look in your makeup! That is where they are usually found, but the FDA says they are "used in hundreds of products, such as toys, vinyl flooring and wall covering, detergents, lubricating oils, food packaging, pharmaceuticals, blood bags and tubing, and personal care products, such as nail polish, hair sprays, aftershave lotions, soaps, shampoos, perfumes, and other fragrance preparations."

Studies have shown more research is needed, but that phthalates not only weaken immunity but possibly contribute to breast cancer (2009 study in the Philosophical Transactions B; 2010 study published in the Environmental Health Perspectives)

Phthalates are often found in cleansers and skin care products - *including sunscreens*.

It's crazy to think that the very thing we put on to prevent cancer may cause it! Pthalates are chemicals that the liver has trouble clearing. *A clogged liver can lead to cancer.* Stay away from Pthalates! How do we protect ourselves while getting the sun we need to make vitamin D?

Start by reading the label. IF you recognize most or all ingredients as food, they should be safe to put on your skin to ingest them. The problem is, chemicals like pthalates are not listed on the label.

Rather than look through all these long names, I protect myself from too many chemicals in my skin care and sunscreen by *internally protecting myself!*

You can eat and drink things like polyphenols - Preventing Sunscreen Cancer (Cont. P. 15)

Volunteer of the Year Riverside Co. District 2

Dr. Jeff Carol from Christian Arts and Theatre received the award on behalf of the non-profit that teaches students the arts with Biblical values in after school programs, weekend workshops and summer camps. The classes are offered in two 15 week sessions, but private tutoring in the arts is also available.




