Mt. Vernon and Center Home Plan



Mt Vernon and Center Streen now has a plan approved by John Hildebrand, head of Planning. Signed documentation says that this project of single family homes will add a "less than significant increase" in noise, lighting, odors, traffic as well as a negligible affect upon endangered species, their habitat and air pollution.

The proposed structures will be designed to meet the 2022 Title 24 Part 6 building standards that require enhanced insulation; Part 11 to require energy efficient appliances and occupant sensors. Interestingly, the

current California Code is encouraging more houses on less land claiming it is

to reduce emissions. [We said, "No!" to the "mixed use"...and "*increased densities* in urban centers" proposed for this lot.

Why is the goal of our California government the opposite of what the people who live here want?

On September 20th, the FDA approved a "self-administer influenza vaccine" aka Flumist. 



Judge Rules Fluoride Lowers Children's IQ

In a decision that could end the practice of water fluoridation in the U. S., a federal judge late Tuesday ruled that water flluoridation at current U. S. levels poses an "unreasonable risk" for reduced IQ in children.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) can no longer ignore that risk, and must take regulatory action, Judge Edward Chen of the Northern District of California wrote in the long-awaited landmark decision.

More than 200 million Americans drink water treated with fluoride at the "optimal" level of .7 milligrams per liter (mmg/L). However, Chen ruled that a preponderance of scientific evidence shows that this level of fluoride exposure may damage human health, particularly that of pregnant mothers and young children. Do Children Belong to Parents or the State?

Do you have children? Do you love your kids? Do you think you, as parents, are the best people to make decisions for their future?

What if the government thought that they knew better than you? That seems to be the case as AB1955 has just passed the CA state representatives and got signed by governor Newsom July 15, 2024. This bill - now law - "prohibits local school boards from implementing policies to notify parents before socially transitioning their children."

You may not be the only one who thinks parents should know what is happening to their children at school as Chino Valley Unified School District filed a countersuit against the state. They say that the new law violates the constitutionally protected, right of parents to direct the care and education of their children.

On September 3, 2024, the City of Huntington Beach, "passed a new ordinance that directly opposes the controversial law" by prohibiting witholding information from parents.

Mayor Gracey Van Der Mark proposed the ordinance and is quoted at GVWire saying, "The issue of a child's gender is personal, private, and should be discussed between the parent and the child only - not dictated by the State."

The Parental Rights Foundation states that, "Historically, the Supreme Court has recognized in the 14th Ammendment's Due Process Clause a fundamental liberty interest of parents in directing the upbringing, education, and care of their minor children. AB 1955 would rob parents of this right by keeping them in the dark about crucial mental health care decisions being made by and for their children."

A court case confirms this by saying in "Troxel v. Granville that 'The liberty interest at issue in this case - the interest of parents in the care, custody, and control of their children - is perhaps the oldest of the fundamental liberty interests recognized by this Court.' 530 US 57 (2000) at 65.

"And in Parham v. J.R., they declared, 'The law's concept of the family rests on a presumption that parents possess what a child lacks in maturity, experience, and capacity for judgment required for making life's difficult decisions 442 US 584 (1979) Natural bonds of affection" may lead parents to act in the best interest of their children.'

A Home Birth Story (Cont. from Sept.) to relax to this little ritual, and I planned to do it when I entered labor.

My mom delivered both myself and my brother early, and we assumed that my body would have a similar timeline. I started maternity leave on Tuesday, April 26. My mom, dad, and their beloved dog Maisie arrived the next day, with a plan to be there for the birth. I was a little over 38 weeks pregnant, and they feared they might not make it in time. After all, I could go into labor any day!

I did not go into labor the day they arrived. Or the next day. Or the day after that. I had a sweet time with my parents for over three weeks, with lots of household chores, walks, and coffee runs. I had time to cross everything off of my before-baby to do list and much much more. But my dad had to get back to work, and this whole waiting-on-baby-thing was lasting longer than planned. When they left the morning of Thursday, May 19, there was no end in sight to this pregnancy.

Everyone we encountered at church or the coffee shop or at Walmart shared their induction stories and asked if we would induce. Sam offered to let me push mow the lawn, claiming the vibration of the mower might induce labor. He still insists the offer was entirely altruistic, but I know how much he hates mowing the lawn.

My friend Teri suggested that I get a prenatal massage. I was already at 40 weeks, and the place was booked a week out. I made the next available appointment - at 41 weeks and 1 day - thinking that I would never get my prenatal massage. I did. The prenatal massage was helpful in getting me to relax. Sam massaged my shoulders when he came home from work that day and said that there was a noticeable difference in my muscle tightness. That was encouraging.

Part III: Birth Day

Friday afternoon - 41 weeks and 5 days - I began to feel contractions with some consistency. They felt like slight cramps in my belly. I knew it was possible for the contractions to lead to nothing, but I also knew deep down that I would be giving birth the next day.

I spent the whole day in preparation. I made chicken soup, brown rice, and laborade. I deep cleaned the kitchen. My mind was racing with thoughts of what the following day could bring, but I kept it to myself.

That night on the front porch, Sam tried to convince me to mow the lawn again (a whole week had passed since his last offer), and I had to come clean. There was no need to kick-start labor. My body had finally done that. Sorry Sam, you're going to have to mow the lawn yourself.

I had contractions all night long. Not painful, but strong enough to wake me up. Every five minutes I woke up to a contraction, pressed the contraction timer

on my phone under my pillow, and immediately fell back to sleep. I leaked bits of fluid throughout the night, and around 2:30am I had some bloody show. I slept in as long as possible, knowing I wouldn't have the opportunity to sleep for the next eighteen years (as many moms had faithfully warned me).

I had a Lara Bar and took a shower around 10:00am. Silly me tried to straighten my bangs. I even had in mind that I would put on makeup (yes, for my water birth). That never happened.

I asked Sam to turn on my relaxing music and run the lavender diffuser. He happily obliged.

"How many drops of lavender do you need?" He asked a minute later. "Just five," I replied.

"Oh, I already used about thirty." The air was thick with lavender.

Next Sam attempted to turn on my playlist of relaxing music. Instead, he clicked the wrong playlist, and *It's a Great Day to Be Alive* by Travis Tritt came on. It might not have been on my relaxing playlist, but it was the perfect song for a birth.

Sam served me some eggs with cheese, and when I was done eating, encouraged me with "now it's time to lay your own egg." He also fresh-squeezed a glass of orange juice from my parents' California oranges. That orange juice was the most refreshing, rejuvenating beverage I can recall consuming in my whole life.



It was stormy and overcast all day. Around 1:00pm, Sam and I went to bed and cuddled, as much as we could with a giant labor ball between my legs. Contractions continued to get more intense. Sam told me I was doing the best labor he had ever seen.

Sam to turn off the lights. It was comforting to be on the other side of the pool, Sam and I were able to in complete darkness. Contractions picked up even watch the whole thing. I saw more and more of our more. Apparently the noises I made while in the baby's head. It looked like the head just kept coming; shower made that abundantly clear to everyone in it was so cone-like. the house.

rived. My friend Teri was there with the video equipment. Another friend, Lindsay, was taking photos. My midwife Deb and assistant Tiffany were there. When I got out, Deb asked if I wanted to be checked. I was curious, so I said yes. I was 4cm and 100% effaced.

She had me start the Miles Circuit. This is a series of positions, meant to line the baby up in preparation for delivery. It's a natural induction method, mostly used to progress labor that has already begun. I threw up laying on our bedroom floor. I became wildly cold, and someone put the comforter over me.

I got in the tub around 5:30pm, and I was nonverbal by 6:00pm. Deb checked me again at 6:40pm, and I was at 5-6cm, with baby very low. I was discouraged. It already felt like it had been ages since she last checked me, and I had only progressed a centimeter or two.

It was what followed that cervical check - progressing from a 6 to a 10 - that was most excruciating for me, both physically and mentally. Not long after Deb checked me, I started to feel pushy, and I was in a lot of pain.

I knew it must be too early to push. Everyone kept telling me that I needed to relax if I was going to make it to a 10, but relaxing was the opposite sensation of what my body was begging me to do. It was excruciating, feeling like every contraction was moving me in the opposite direction of where I needed to go.

It was at that point that I felt like I could not go on. This is it. I'm going to be labeled "Failure to Progress." I kept all the negative thoughts to myself, refusing to speak them out loud. I tried my best to relax, deciding that the hospital was not an option.

Little did I know how quickly my body was progressing. Around 7:30pm, I attempted to communicate how hard it was for me to relax, when all I wanted to do was push. In my head, I communicated this articulately to all present in the room. According to Sam, this sounded more like "ARGHHHHHH. PUSH!"

Regardless, Deb got the idea. She didn't even offer to check me again; she knew I was ready. At that point,

Sam had already been in the pool with me for quite a while. He had his arms wrapped around me, and I pushed as I leaned back against him. It had taken me less than an hour to progress from a "5 or 6" to a 10.

I do not remember this part being painful. Pushing was a relief. I could finally do what my body had been I took another shower around 3:00pm, and I asked begging for. With our floor length mirror propped up

I will always remember the moment after his body By this point, everyone on my birth team had ar- came out, when Deb caught him and put him on my chest. His cone head and disproportionately long arms. His massive hands. His slightly open, helpless eyes. His blueish, quivering, little body. Time stopped in that surreal moment. Here was the child who has been growing in me for the past ten months. Here was the baby I had spent every moment with for nearly a year, yet hardly knew at all. This creature felt so foreign, so alien.



Deb instructed me to give the baby a few breaths, as he did not breathe right away. I did not even have the chance to be concerned. Before I was able to follow her instructions, he coughed and let out a soft cry. It was the sweetest sound we had ever heard.

Deb gave him a few inflation breaths to help him out. They confirmed the time of birth: 8:40pm. The cord was wrapped around something, making it so that I nearly dunked my newborn babe into the water several times. Deb unwound the cord and we waited until it stopped pulsating for Sam to cut it. I lifted him up off my chest and made the long awaited-for announcement: "It's a boy!"

The realization I still needed to get the placenta out was deflating. I thought that all my hard work was done. Pushing the placenta out as the culmination of all my labor had never entered my mind that day. I attempted to push, but it just wasn't coming out.

Sam got out of the pool and brought Freeman to the bedroom. Deb gave me some herbs to help the placenta to separate. I squatted outside the pool, and the placenta finally came out close to a half hour postbirth.
