All of my life, I've heard, "turn that light off! We don't need to spend more on electricity!"




Avoid Center St. if you can until BNSF repairs the tracks again or risk vehicle damage...

We all pay property taxes, either directly as a homeowner, or indirectly as a renter. Before Howard Jarvis' Proposition 13 went into effect, property taxes were based on the current market value of a property, re-assessed each year. Back then, all the way back in 1978, over 47 years ago, the average State tax rate was 2.76%.

Prop.13, limited the annual increase to 2% of the initial assessed value, as long as you own your property. No re-assessments except for change of ownership, or new construction. It also capped the statewide property tax at 1%. If that wasn't in place, how high do you think the state property tax would be now, 47 years later?

#### Prop.13 saved you from huge annual increases.

Prop.13 also enshrined in our state constitution that state tax increases would require a two-thirds vote in each house of the legislature. *THIS* is why it is attacked every election cycle...



Know the Other Bills Your Government is Up To punished for being allowed a choice on "medi-This is a list of California Bills recently introduced with their stated intent, possible concerns and if the bills become law, we can look forward to more crime, more apartments in areas with homes higher taxes and parental rights undermined.

AB 130 Intent: Limits public hearings and approval deadlines to speed up affordable housing development and protect developers from local rule changes. Concerns: favors developers over community input. Signed into law July 10, 2025.

SB 131 Article 3 inacts: Round 7 of the Homeless Housing, Assistance, and Prevention **Program** They called it a plan to "Boost Affordability" by exempting CEQA from certain housing and infrastucture projects like "homeless housing..., daycare centers... pollution risks ...seen as rushed to undermine what local homeowners prefer. Signed into law July 10, 2025. Read bill here: legiscan. com/CA/text/SB131/id/3259518 / Editor's note: Guys... This may be what Planning is planning at California and Center. He said the preliminary EIR is all that is required on such "projects" - as proposed on California St. The law reads that, "... expand that exemption to include a right-of-way of a local street or road." (California St. would be such a road.) Should Highgrove residents be a "compliant" neighbor for "affordable housing" that could be nine story apartments for the homeless?

Even if we agree to fewer floors. Is that what we want here? We had better be prepared to invest in people's lives or it could become a horror movie (and the only real change comes if they WANT to accept Jesus and change, IMO) Many homeless I have spoken with have chosen that life and do not want help. The government's offer of five hundred million dollars to build "affordable housing" (IF they spent 50% of the sixth round - how much are they spending FOR US?!) must be tempting to Planning, but is this the best thing for Highgrove?]

SB 79 Overrides local zoning to allow up to ninestory dense housing near transit stops in singlefamily areas. Homeowners fear neighborhood disruption and property value drops; opposed for overriding local control. On Governor's desk (pending decision by October 12, 2025).

AB 2240 Expands Medi-Cal coverage for undocumented immigrants, some view it as prioritizing non-citizens over residents. Signed into law September 24, 2024 (effective 2025).

SB 969 (Senator Scott Wiener) Allows cannabis lounges/cafes in cities with under 96% vaccination rates to aid post-pandemic recovery. Are we being

cal interventions" like vaccines?! What about the youth having more access to drugs? Signed into law September 28, 2024 (effective 2025).

AB 1955 Prohibits schools from outing students' sexual orientation/gender identity without consent. Limits parental rights; Signed into law (effective January 1, 2025).

AB 2943 Eases aggregation of similar theft/drug crimes for felony charges to combat retail theft. Reform advocates fear it erodes Prop 47 reductions; seen as politically motivated response to **Prop 36.** Signed into law August 2024 (effective January 1, 2025).

SB 771 Holds large social media platforms liable for civil penalties (up to \$1M per violation) if their algorithms amplify content that violates California's civil rights laws, such as threats, harassment, or intimidation based on protected characteristics (e.g., race, religion, gender, sexual orientation). Some argue it violates First Amendment rights, infringes on editorial discretion, and conflicts with Section 230 protections, potentially leading to overcensorship and chilling legitimate speech

This is an egregious affront to free speech in the digital age. - Marty Bent

On Governor's desk pending decision by October 12, 2025; (operative January 1, 2027 if signed). *You* can still call against this!!!

SB 1174 - Stops cities from requiring Voter ID

AB 144 Requires health plans to cover preventive care services (e.g., immunizations, screenings) without cost-sharing if recommended by federal bodies like the CDC as of January 1, 2025, or by the California Department of Public Health; empowers state to adopt vaccine schedules from medical societies instead of the CDC. Critics worry it gives the fox control over the hen house; inconsistent national standards; and insurers are concerned about added coverage mandates amid rising costs. Signed and effective immediately.

**SB 1123** Updates SB 684 (2023) to streamline ministerial (non-discretionary) review for small subdivisions creating up to 10 residential units on vacant lots in single-family zones near transit/jobs; promotes affordable housing without hearings.

Homeowners oppose it for potentially altering neighborhood character and overriding local zoning; what about our traffic? Infrastructure? Signed into law September 19, 2024 (effective July 1, '25) AB 549 Establishes the Resilient Rebuilding Authority for the Los Angeles Wildfires. Aims to finance and streamline rebuilding in wildfireaffected areas through bonds and streamlined...

#### Why No On Prop 50

"...In California, back in 2008, we voted to use a bi-partisan commission to redraw Congressional districts, instead of allowing only majority partisan politicians to do so, as they do in Texas. This was *the Voters First Act*, which went into effect in 2010, a census year.

#### It is the current law in California.

For those they may have forgotten their civics lessons, a census must be taken every ten years, by law... That's right: 2030. Five years from now. That's the law. And, it STILL has nothing to do with Trump.

Our governor, Gavin Newsom, now wants to not only "temporarily" disband the independent bipartisan commission, but, he also wants to redistrict for next year, in the middle of a census cycle. Since this is against the law, he is forcing, AT GREAT TAXPAYER EXPENSE, a special election THIS YEAR. November 2025, to be specific.

He, and his fellow politicians have already drawn up their proposed districts. However, *they will not tell us who it was that drew up the districts.* How's that for transparency?

This IS gerrymandering. If you answered "No" to my earlier question about gerrymandering, then you should be consistent, and be against **Proposition 50.** 

Here is the breakdown:

# Current Law: Independent bi-partisan committee draws lines

New Law: Mysterious unnamed biased political group draws lines

Current Law: Draw lines every census (10 years)

New Law: Draw lines now (or, whenever they feel like it)

Current Law: Established commission of specifically named individuals

New Law: "Temporarily" remove established commission of specifically named individuals, and replace their power with partisan unnamed biased politicians (when has the government EVER done anything "temporarily"?)

I've already seen two separate *commercials that lie* ...about what Proposition 50 is about, framing it as a retaliation on Trump... Don't be fooled. Trump had nothing to do with Texas, and he has nothing to do with Proposition 50. That is all Newsom, gerrymandering and trying to grab more power away from the people...The two commercials that I have seen, online, as I primarily watch streaming, are completely deceptive and misleading. *They actually state the OPPOSITE of what Proposition 50 is about...*Mark R Root Sr., Facebook

I seriously want to stop talking about Newsom then he does one more thing to undermine Californians but it would be wrong not to let you know.

Some bills seem to work together for a purpose. He signed these two new bills into law.

One installs a committee with the right to give land destroyed by fire to be taken for low income *housing.* The other makes some fire victims have to pay the full cost to repair homes damaged in the fire...Do your research!! You may know more!

73% of California voted for Prop 36 to cut crime, yet Newsom was against it.

As Californians struggle with soaring prices, crime, and a collapsing quality of life, Sacramento politicians have sent another wave of terrible bills to Governor Gavin Newsom's desk.

His Top Ten Worst Bills on the Governor's Desk:

AB 1207—The Tax-and-Spend Increase extends California's Cap-and Trade Program "the practical effect is clear: higher utility and fuel prices for years to come...AB 1207 is nothing but a massive hidden tax on working families," warns DeMaio. "Newsom knows this will send energy bills through the roof—and he doesn't care. Veto this or admit you're declaring economic war on Californians."

**SB 301**—The Pension Handcuffs Bill

SB 301 amends the County Employees Retirement Law to lose flexibility to limit who receives pension benefits under CERL.

"SB 301 is financial suicide," and "...handcuffs taxpayers to gold-plated pensions forever. Newsom signing this is the same as bankrupting California on purpose."

AB 596—Rigging Ballot Labels deliberately SB549&SB782 Make Californians Victims Again? hides who is funding the opposition. "This is election fraud by design," warns De Maio

SB 79—State Takeover of Local Housing

Forces cities to approve high-density housing near transit regardless of local zoning or com-(see quote on Front P.) munity plans.

AB 495 The 'Let Strangers Seize Children Bill Allows strangers to claim guardianship simply by signing a form..."This bill is crazy," DeMaio says. "It tears children away from parents and hands them to strangers with zero safeguards. No sane person should support this."

SB 155—The State-Run Media Bill Allows the Governor to funnel taxpayer money to chosen media outlets across California. "This is government propaganda—plain and simple," warns DeMaio. "Newsom wants to buy off the press with your money so they cover up his failures."

SB 596—Crushing Rural Hospitals

AB 692—Banning Employee Incentives Prohibits benefits like tuition assistance or signing bonuses if they are contingent on staying in the job. "This is the dumbest, most antiworker bill yet," says DeMaio.

AB 1071—Giving Criminals New Loopholes Allows felons to use the Racial Justice Act to overturn sentences based on statistical disparities, regardless of individual facts. "This bill is a get-out-of-jail free card for predators and violent criminals," and makes California even more dangerous. DeMaio says these bills prove once again that Sacramento politicians care more about unions, criminals, and fridge activists than hardworking Californians. ReformCalifornia.org
