



Who should draw your district lines?

In 2008, California voted in the Voters First Act to prevent politicians from drawing congressional districts. This act created a non-partisan, Citizens Redistricting Commission to draw out new legislative districts with every census.

This commission is made up of 4 registered Democrats, 4 registered Republicans and 4 who have not claimed a specific party. In order to pass new lines, three of each have to agree that they are fair.

It may not be a perfect system, but it does seem to be more reasonable than to allow those in office who would benefit, to be the ones to draw the lines.

But Newsom is calling for a special vote. His website admits that his purpose is to balance Texas' new districting. California will work on its own redistricting map, and "...go full-steam ahead in an effort to cancel out the five seats gained by the GOP in Texas."

\$200 million is estimated to be the cost to make this statewide special election happen.

My number one problem is thinking too much. Thinking too much ruins confidence. Thankfully, confidence is something that I learned, and you can learn it too.


Here are two sports psychology tips that will give you untouchable confidence in baseball:

Visualize the trajectory of the ball, the exact point of contact, and the satisfaction of squaring up a ball right on the sweet spot. Is AB495, "A Kidnappers Dream Bill"?

Have you heard the controversy? Some say it protects children, some say it takes away a parent's rights. I had to dig in and find the truth.

On the surface it looks pretty good. Protect immigrant children. Of course, we want to protect all children, right?

But there is some verbiage in this bill that I find very concerning:

"(e) Nothing in this section prohibits the governing board or body of a local educational agency from establishing stronger standards and protections."

It almost makes it sound like it gives the governing board or local educational agency pretty heavy rights - that *they* are allowed to determine.

Is it important to constantly update school records on all students in the district? As a homeschooling mom, I would not have liked another hoop to jump through... but I would be especially concerned about the terms, "including but not limited to..."

"...including, but not limited to, information related to plans for family safety and the importance of providing the school with, and regularly updating, emergency contact information, including secondary and additional contact information."

But this is worded way worse. Can you imagine a non-family member without ID, filling out a form that will allow them control over your child's education and allow a district medical professional to do as they will for a year?

"6550. (a) (1) A caregiver's authorization affidavit that meets the requirements of this part authorizes a caregiver 18 years of age or older who completes items 1 to 4, inclusive, of the affidavit provided in Section 6552 and signs the affidavit to enroll a minor in school and consent to school-related medical care on behalf of the minor. A caregiver who is a relative *or a nonrelative* extended family member and who completes items 1 to 8, inclusive, of the affidavit provided in Section 6552 and *signs the affidavit shall have the same rights* to authorize medical care and dental care for the minor that are given to guardians under Section 2353 of the Probate Code..."

There is no requirement for identification for the person filling out the form and taking any child out of school or getting a child medical treatment without parental notification.

Please read AB495 and tell your assemblyperson,

"No on AB 495, please keep our children safe."

And, while you're at it, please mention that,
"In greated rights mend to be protected at all costs."

This is to avoid the appearance of conducting business outside of a publicly noticed meeting and to remain in compliance with open meeting laws.



New Road is All We Need to Bypass Trains!

[Editor's Note: R.A. "Barney Barnett", Founder of the Highgrove Happenings Newspaper has a great (old) idea to help alleviate our traffic from trains!]

Long freight trains divide Highgrove in half and block traffic on Main St. and Center St. A new road, only six tenths of a mile long on the abandoned (in 2014) Union Pacific (UPR) right-of-way is all we need to give access to the Iowa Avenue Overpass.

This new two lane road would be on a dirt road called California St., that has been used for illegal dumping for many years.

There is ample room for one lane in each direction between Center St. and Citrus St.

Citrus St. connects to the Iowa Overpass where there is a traffic signal at the top. Traffic from both sides of the tracks will be able to get to the other side instead of having to wait on the trains!

Emergency vehicles such as fire trucks, ambulances, law enforcement and daily commuters, would have access to the overpass to avoid the trains.

In 2008, Center St. and Main St. were both blocked for 18 hours due to a train derailment.

The \$31.3 million dollar Iowa Avenue Overpass opened on June 8, 2014 but after eleven years, it is time to use it when trains block our streets.


Three more reasons why we need a short road between Spring St. and Iowa Ave.!

4 The solution: Build a new road parallel to the railroad tracks instead of crossing over them!







Brain Health Part II

Years ago when I worked at Clark's Nutritional Center, the Director of Education there shared an article with me that was fascinating.

Have you ever wondered if there was proof that vitamins did something? Many people don't know their history. Vitamins are named so because if someone is lacking in a vitamin there is a deadly disease that they could get... for example, children that do not have a certain amount of sunlight or vitamin D get rickets or a disease associated with improper bone development in their legs. Let me know if you'd like me to share examples in a future issue!

Well, I shared his excitement as we read a journal article that *used an MRI to see how certain* **B-Vitamins light up the brain!**

P-5-P (coenzyme B6), methylfolate (B9) and methylcobalmin (B12) are the b vitamins that they found not only lit up the brain, but these *nutrients actually prevent brain shrinkage!*

That was exciting enough, but when you add to this the research that shows *they also lower homocysteine levels* (high homocysteine is the most reliable marker for cardiovascular issues) it makes me glad I take a quality b complex every day! My recent favorite is by Emerald Labs. (I'm not an affiliate - but like them enough to become one day!)

I like their B-Healthy because there are quality B vitamins in their formulation (some companies use cheaper forms - for example, instead of pyradoxil-5-Phosphate, a cheaper version would be pyrodoxine hydrochloride) and may contain tableting ingredients that I try to avoid like magnesium stearate (that B-Healthy does not contain).

This is why I buy my vitamins from Sprouts or Clark's Nutritional Centers to get cleaner, better quality vitamins than pharmaceutical manufacturers make for grocery and drug stores.


