This issue is one of national appreciation as we explore quotes from the foundations of Freedom, and its opposite, socialism. (*Highgrove Updates in Aug!*)

George Washington, our first President, was said to be a humble man of great character. (George Washington, the Character and Influence of One Man) He was also a wise businessman.

"He looked after his own and his wife's plantations so well that in a few years [before his Pres.] he became one of the richest men in America."

- *Beginner's History Mace, California State 1916*

George Washington wrote 39 volumes, edited by John C. Fitzpatrick. During the 200th anniversary of his birth celebration in 1932, then President, Herbert Hoover said, *George Washington is "the most voluminous American writer of this period... his principles of government have had more influence on the development of the American commonwealth than those of any other man."*



"The Constitution is the official foundation for our national life.
It is an important key to what is good and what is bad in our political life.
It is the key to freedom and the answer to tyranny. It is not something that is just *helpful* to know; correct constitutional theory is *the one thing that as citizens we must know."*

His Excellency, George Washington rode around among his army yesterday and *admonished each and every one to fear God, to put away the wickedness that has set in* and become so general, and to practice the Christian virtues. From all appearances this gentleman does not belong to the so-called world of society, but he respects God's Word, believes in the atonement through Christ, and bears himself in humility and gentleness. Therefore the LORD God, has also singularly, yea, marvelously preserved him from harm in the midst of countless perils, ambushes, fatigues, etc., and has hitherto graciously held him in his hand as a chosen vessel."

During the Battle of the Monongahela in 1755, a young George Washington served as an aide to General Edward Braddock when British forces were ambushed by French and Native American fighters. *Washington rode repeatedly through intense fire to rally troops and had two horses shot out from under him. After the battle, Washington discovered that four bullets had pierced his coat, but none had touched his skin. He attributed his survival to divine intervention, writing to his brother that he had been protected "beyond all human probability or expectation" by the "all-powerful dispensations of Providence."*

The Tradition of Prayer before Decision-Making

"The opening of sessions of legislative and other deliberate public bodies with prayer is deeply embedded in the history and tradition of this country.

Dr. Benjamin Rush signed the Declaration of Independence and participated in the Continental Congress. A practicing doctor and professor of chemistry in the medical departments at the College of Philadelphia and the University of Pennsylvania, he wrote many medical books, published medical textbooks; taught in the medical schools of Philadelphia and helped develop the field of psychiatry. He represented Pennsylvania at the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776, as the youngest signer at 30 years old. Benjamin Rush then attended the Continental Congress, served on its medical committee, and provided medical support on the field of battle. He was appointed to serve as the Surgeon General of the Middle Department of the Continental Army. His concerns about maintaining medical supplies and hygienic conditions during the Revolutionary War eventually led to internal conflicts and his resignation. He then continued his medical practice, teaching and publishing. [See quote, last page]

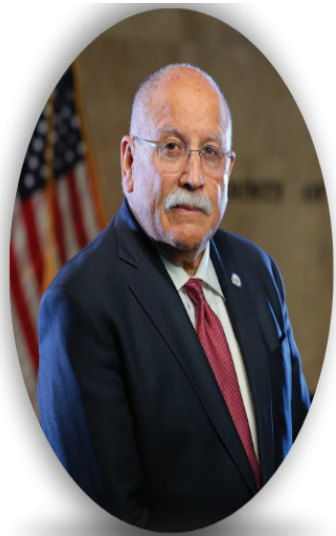

Partnership Launches First Community Cleanup Effort in Highgrove

On Saturday, June 13, 2026, the first Highgrove Community Cleanup officially kicked off near Iowa Avenue and Villa Street, marking an important investment in the ongoing effort to improve and revitalize the Highgrove community.

Led by Riverside County Supervisor Jose Medina's District 1 Office, the cleanup was made possible through a strong partnership with the Greater Riverside Chambers of Commerce and Keep Riverside Clean & Beautiful, organizations committed to supporting healthier and stronger communities throughout Riverside County.

By the end of the cleanup effort, the partnership had made an immediate impact:

- 49 volunteers participated
- 4 cleanup sites addressed
- 1,785 pounds of litter removed
- 5,600 pounds of green waste collected
- 620 cigarette butts collected

Supervisor Jose Medina emphasized that this effort reflects a broader commitment to investing in communities that deserve long-term attention and resources.

"Real community progress happens when we invest not only in infrastructure, but in people and partnerships committed to creating change. The work accomplished in Highgrove shows what can happen when organizations and local government come together with a shared commitment to building cleaner, stronger communities for everyone."

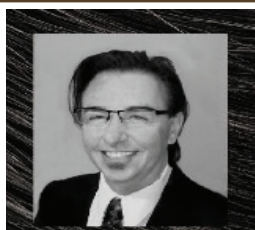

In New York Harbor, the British keep coming. More and more sails appear off Staten Island, with the anchored fleet thickening hour by hour. George Washington spends his day in a fury of preparation as he inspects earthworks, shifting regiments, dictating orders, all the while knowing that an attack could fall at any moment, even though he is uncertain where it might occur. Washington's letters to Congress carry the strain of a commander waiting at the ready but still unsure of what is on the horizon. (One of these dispatches, dated June 29th, is brought to Congress as it prepares for the fateful week.)

By contrast, in Philadelphia, the 30th feels very still. There is a hush. Jefferson's draft Declaration, which was given to Congress on the 28th, sits on the table, read once and set aside. The delegates are all aware of what tomorrow will bring. Congress resolved that, on July 1st, it would form itself into a committee of the whole and take up the question of independence. Behind the scenes, the persuasion game goes on. Several colonies are still wavering: Pennsylvania and South Carolina lean against signing, Delaware sits divided, New York's delegates are bound by year-old instructions. John Adams, the "colossus of independence," works the room, bringing up arguments he has, by his own weary admission, which he has repeated a hundred times over the past six months.

Word is beginning to travel north of a resounding victory in the South: On June 28th at Charleston, a half-finished palmetto-log fort on Sullivan's Island had stayed standing after a daylong bombardment by the Royal Navy. The British fleet had been driven off! If colonists could repel the world's mightiest navy there, maybe there was hope moving forward!

And so the month of June closes with the country (and her people) poised on a knife's edge. An enemy fleet is gathering in the north, a new republic stirring to life in the south, and in Philadelphia...a single room is full of anxious men about to decide whether any of it will mean a nation or being guilty of treason." - Rachel Reeves on Substack

Historian's View of Christianity Cont. From Front P. from an Election Sermon delivered in Charlestown, April 25, 1799, from the Bible text, "If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?" (Psalm 11:3). "Our dangers are of two kinds, those which affect our religion, and those which affect our government. They are, however, so closely allied that they cannot, with propriety, be separated. *The foundations which support the interests of Christianity, are also necessary to support a free and equal government like our own.* In all those countries where there is little or no religion, or a very gross and corrupt one, as in Mahometan and Pagan countries, there you will find, with scarcely a single exception, arbitrary and tyrannical governments, gross ignorance and wickedness, and deplorable wretchedness among the people.

To the kindly influence of Christianity we owe that degree of civil freedom, and political and social happiness which mankind now enjoy. *In proportion as the genuine effects of Christianity are diminished in any nation, either through unbelief, or the corruption of its doctrines, or the neglect of its institutions; in the same proportion will the people of that nation recede from the blessings...*" of genuine freedom, and approximate the miseries of complete despotism. I hold this to be a truth confirmed by experience. If so, it follows, that all efforts made to destroy the foundations of our holy religion, ultimately tend to the subversion also of our political freedom and happiness. Whenever the pillars of Christianity shall be overthrown, our present republican forms of government, and all the blessings which flow from them, must fall with them."
